This will enable families to pick-up children at the same time after the school bell rings at 3:03 pm. Students being transported by designated school district buses such as the "Paul Lake Bus" are also part of this after school supervision plan.

We will encourage all other elementary students to make their way home after school. This will help them avoid the vehicular and pedestrian traffic related to our large neighbour, South Kamloops Secondary School.

GUIDELINES FOR ELECTRONIC DEVICES

As per the District's Policy 406.1, the safe keeping of these devices are solely the responsibility of the owners. We ask that elementary students use the office phone when calling parents during the day, due to illness or urgent matters.

School equipment such as digital cameras and movie cameras may be used for school activities with the permission of the teacher but no other recording/photographic devices may be used at any time.

SECONDARY MATH PUZZLERS

THREE KSA MUSIC STUDENTS AT A HOTEL RIDDLE

Three Music students have to share a hotel room for the night while they are on tour.

When they get to the hotel, they pay the \$300 fee, then go up to their room. Soon the bellhop brings up their bags and gives the students back \$5 because the hotel was having a special discount that weekend.
